## April 15, 2021 Letter from Unitarian Universalist Association President to Congregations:

I write today with guidance from the UUA about planning for safe operations in alignment with our UU values. The significant disruptions to life in our congregations and communities over the past year has been traumatic. There is, understandably, a deep yearning to gather again in person. Unfortunately, we are in an “in-between” transition time that continues to be risky. Our first concern continues to be safeguarding the well-being of our people and the public.

Last May, the UUA recommended that congregations plan for a year of virtual operations. Moving into the coming year, the UUA recommends that congregations plan for multi-platform operations—a flexible combination of in-person and online engagement based on the needs and risks in your community.

### Key Principles for Planning

**As a faith community, we root our decisions in the values of inclusion and consent.** It’s important that everyone who gathers in person has the ability to consent to do so, so that no one is forced to choose between their congregation and the safety of themselves or their loved ones. This includes congregational staff and volunteers. When making decisions, the people responsible for congregational programs need to have a central role and those impacted by decisions must have input. As religious leaders, our role is to help facilitate conversation and decision-making in an atmosphere of mutual respect, acknowledging that members and staff have a variety of needs and perspectives.

*In our church, a [Pandemic Policy Team](#), comprised of staff members and congregants with relevant professional expertise and congregational leadership experience, has been meeting regularly to create policies that help us make good decisions that take the varying needs of our congregants and staff into consideration. They monitor the science and local public health statistics, adapting policy to reflect changing information. Information about our Pandemic Response is kept updated on the church website.*

**Follow the science.** Congregations should follow the latest CDC guidelines and local public health regulations to determine the best ways to move forward as the pandemic recedes. Our public health advisors have all stressed the dangers of this time and the need to remain vigilant. Vaccine distribution remains uneven and inequitable (nationally and globally), new and more contagious variants are spreading and children are not yet eligible for vaccination. Many unanswered questions remain, such as how effective the vaccines are in response to emerging variants, whether vaccinated people can spread the virus, and how long vaccine protection lasts. I can’t stress strongly enough the need to proceed with caution in our planning.

## 6/27/2021 “UUA General Assembly Worship”

Join us for the largest annual gathering of UUs convening virtually for worship as part of the Unitarian Universalist Association's General Assembly. Worship will be provided by First Universalist Church of Minneapolis. First Universalist has been a model of shared ministry and what it means to put the work of dismantling white supremacy and building anti-racist, anti-oppressive practices at the center of their ministry. They have been on the front lines in support of the Movement for Black Lives in Minneapolis, bringing spiritual care and moral leadership in the wake of George Floyd’s murder by police and the important uprisings for justice that followed. Children and families are a vital part of their ministry, and they have been using creative approaches to engage all ages in worship during the pandemic. Their leadership exemplifies some of the best practices for the creativity, spiritual depth, and moral leadership that is possible when we embrace the work of shared ministry rooted in love and justice.

**Go slow and be flexible.** Now is the time to plan and consult with the people responsible and engaged in your programs. Take time to create a shared understanding of the risks. Given the ongoing risks, worship and other large gatherings should not be the first thing we return to in person. Our public health officials have also said that as we begin to have some in-person offerings, we have to be prepared to shift back to all virtual if conditions change. Create this expectation, flexibility and resiliency from the beginning.

*We were live-streaming worship prior to the pandemic shut-down and have learned how having a virtual option for participation allows us to be a more inclusive community. We are already upgrading our technological capabilities to be able to offer a virtual participation option as an ongoing way to include all who wish to participate, whether in worship or small group meetings.*

**Be humane and realistic with expectations of ourselves and others.** Remember, the goal is not perfection. The most important values in this time are care and compassion. We've experienced a year of traumatic disruption and loss. Be realistic as leaders and convey realistic expectations to your congregations. There are well-founded concerns that multi-platform ministry will require additional work without additional staff and volunteer capacity. It's important to have honest conversations about our capabilities and expectations. And keep in mind that significant changes might be overwhelming even if dearly wanted.

*The involvement and leadership of our church members and friends will help determine our path forward, and on what time line. What skills or talents do you have to help us move forward into multi-platform ministry? Are you interested in leading worship this summer (with tech support from Rev. Lyn Marshall?) Might you join our Building Reboot Team to help freshen up the building over the summer? Would you be willing to "mentor" a newcomer who joined us during the pandemic as they integrate into our congregational life? Could you help us improve our accessibility and inclusion for those with disabilities, both in the building and in our virtual offerings?*

In the midst of so much loss and tragedy, it has been the life-saving practices of centering care, inclusion, collaboration and compassion that have held and guided us so well. Finding ways to share ministry, to partner across congregations and lean on each other has been a gift this year and one we can continue to draw on as we move forward. These are the values and tools that will continue to guide us.

## Proposed Governance Policy Changes

At the Annual Meeting we will vote on several proposed bylaws changes as published on the [Warrant](#). The Board of Trustees recommends these changes to better align our bylaws with policy-based governance and to allow the Executive/Senior Minister more flexibility in daily operations, with appropriate oversight. If the proposed bylaws changes are approved by the congregation, the Board intends to also amend their governance policies to support the bylaws changes. [Click here to read the current governance policies](#). The governance policy changes would be:

2.5.4 Original Policy: The Chair, in accordance with the bylaws, signs contracts as the authorized representative of the Board and is authorized to sign checks.

*Amended Policy: The Chair is authorized to sign contracts and agreements, is a bank signatory, and is authorized to sign checks.*

4.4.1. Original Policy: (The Executive shall not) Allow any reallocation of budgeted funds to deviate materially from the congregationally approved budget as specified in the bylaws.

*Amended Policy: In anticipation of a revenue surplus as determined by the Executive and Finance Team, the Executive shall not spend more than 2% over budgeted revenue for the fiscal year without approval of the Board and not spend more than 5% over budgeted revenue without approval of the Membership. The revenue surplus may be spent in the current or the subsequent fiscal year.*

4.4.8 New Policy. The following policy was added:

*(The Executive shall not) sign any contract or agreement involving a commitment beyond the terms and timeline of an annual operations budget, capital budget, or designated funds, without approval from the Board of Trustees.*

4.6.5. Original Policy: (The Executive shall not) Make any purchases not provided for in either the capital expenditure or operational budget projections.

*Amended Policy: (The Executive shall not) make any purchases not provided for in the annual operations budget, capital budget, or designated funds, without approval from the Board of Trustees.*

In the UU hallway, outside the main office is a pile of Solar Viewing Glasses. All church friends and members are welcome to take 2 free pairs per family. Any additional glasses you need, Rik just asks that you put \$1 each into the envelope to help offset his cost.



## **Pandemic Update – We're starting to re-open!**

On May 23, we started welcoming small groups of vaccinated people into the Sanctuary for worship, with a few more watching the live-stream together in Fellowship Hall. We are sending out a sign up link via email and text – right now weekly, but maybe eventually for a few weeks at a time. We plan to send the sign up link out at around 2 pm on Sundays, with a deadline to sign up by the following Thursday morning.

Preference is given to those who have not attended in the Sanctuary previously. Otherwise, it is a random selection process, and we'll let you know if you were selected by 5 pm on Thursdays.

### **How many people can attend worship?**

As of May 30, Merrimack County has "moderate" transmission, which puts us in [Phase 3](#) of our policy - but Phase 2, if everyone is vaccinated. We are welcoming up to 25 vaccinated households to the Sanctuary. The amount of households permitted may go up (or down) if transmission gets better (or hopefully not worse.)

We encourage people who aren't vaccinated to continue watching the live-stream for the time being, and we hope to have you join us in person when transmission declines even further.

### **When can Covenant Groups and committee meetings happen?**

Since we're now in Phase 3, a group of 5 households (and max 10 people, e.g. 5 individuals or 5 couples) may meet in Fellowship Hall. If everyone in the group is vaccinated, the number of attendees may increase to 15 people from a max of 10 households.

Take advantage of the lovely weather and meet outdoors! In keeping with CDC guidance, we've relaxed our [outdoor meeting rules](#):

- No masks required outside
- Physical distance of only 3 feet required
- Allowed to enter building for restrooms
- Although vaccinations are not required for outdoor meetings, singing is allowed if everyone is vaccinated.
- We even have a fire pit for your group's enjoyment!

### **What ventilation, masking, and social distance precautions are in place?**

Masks and 6 foot distancing are still required indoors, regardless of your vaccination status.

The Sanctuary ventilation system has been adjusted to provide extra ventilation. In addition, a portable HEPA air filter is placed between the unmasked worship leader and the masked people in the pews.

In Fellowship Hall, a mechanical engineer has assured us that our ventilation well exceeds code for the small groups we will be allowing. Staff will program the ventilation to run whenever the room is occupied. A portable HEPA air filter will also be running.

### **What do you mean by "multi-platform programs"?**

We value inclusion of people who can not or prefer not to attend in-person gatherings due to COVID, or for any other reason. We'll continue to provide a rich livestream experience even as more people worship in person. We've set up a projector and camera in Fellowship Hall to allow hybrid meetings. A virtual option will be provided for any gathering upon request of one or more person(s).

### **Are rentals permitted?**

In Phase 3 we are open for recurring support groups (subject to group size restrictions) but not for new rentals. New rentals will not resume until Phase 1.

## UU SOFTBALL

Folks: it appears that we will have a softball season again this year. As always, looking for players of all ages, and hopefully a few youngsters to take the pressure off of some of us semi-geezers. Due to the rain at the end of May we have moved our **first practice to Sunday, June 6, around 1:00 at the old State Hospital grounds field off Pleasant Street.**

If you can find someone to throw with, please do so. There is a batting cage in Concord for those nearby. At the least, stretch and get those muscles and bones used to moving again!

**The games will start Monday, June 21 and they are always on Mondays at 6:00.** The schedule is not yet made out, but I'll get it to you as soon as I have it. Players have to be at least 15 years old to play. By the time play begins, I think masks will not be necessary outdoors, but the various team captains are meeting soon to discuss rules for this season. Friendly competition, and disagreements are worked out by team captains. If a player can't run, pinch runners are available. However, all players must play some field position in order to bat. At least 3 women are required to be on the field on defense at all times, or that team is penalized an out in each even inning. Also, there must be 3 female batters in the first 10 batters in the order. No bunting (slow pitch), no stealing and there is an 8 run mercy rule per inning.

## SOLAR ARRAY NEWS

When Lea Smith noticed that the Unitil bill did not seem correct, showing too little power being sent by the solar array to the grid, we asked for an investigation by Norwich Solar Technologies. Gary Schroeder assisted in the investigation. The conclusion was that the array had blown a fuse during a winter power surge.

While the array is now functioning and sending power to the grid, some damage was done to at least one of the inverters. Anders LaScala of Norwich Solar Technologies reports that such damage is rare but not unknown.

After consulting Fronius, the manufacturer of the two inverters, Norwich Solar Technologies decided to replace both of them, charging us for labor but not for the new inverters.

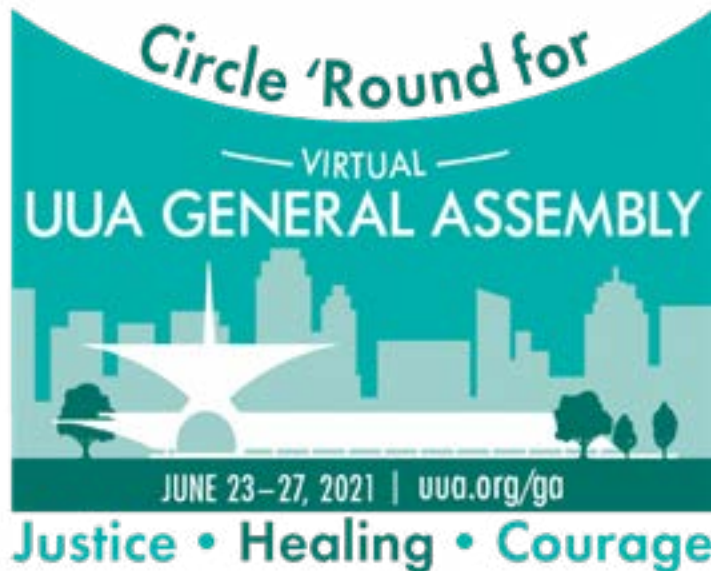
