12/3/2023 “Dancing with Mystery” Rev. Michael Leuchtenberger

God is mystery. Much of life remains a mystery, often beyond words, yet palpable, real, and open to understanding at some deeper, mysterious level of conscious and unconscious awareness. The mystery shows up in music & art, in the miracles of nature, the brilliance and emptiness of space, the cycles of life, the return from a near-death experience, the silence of meditation, the marvel of relationships. We can't easily hold onto the mystery, but we can sense it and feel it if we can be playful with it, dance with it, and allow it to resonate in the sanctuaries of our bodies and the sacred spaces in which we linger and let our souls breathe. Come join the dance. Come dance with mystery. Come dance with God.

12/10/2023 “Awe, Yes Please” Rev. Michael Leuchtenberger

“Awe is the emotion we experience when we encounter vast mysteries that we don't understand,” writes Dacher Keltner in his book “Awe: The New Science of Everyday Wonder and How It Can Transform Your Life.” We can find awe anywhere. It requires no money or the burning of fossil fuels. All of us can find our own meaningful path to awe, Keltner rightfully claims. He shows how awe brings us joy, meaning and community, along with healthier bodies and more creative minds. How do we deepen our relations with the wonders of life? How do we say “yes” to awe each day with gratitude and joy? Come hear the choir tug at your heart with music from Mozart's Requiem and the Hallelujah by Leonard Cohen.

12/17/2023 “Embracing the Dark” Rev. Michael Leuchtenberger

Three ways we will embrace the dark: First, a celebration of the darkness so helpful for regeneration, for slowing down, for fallow time, sleep, sabbatical, and rebirth. Then a heeding of the darker sides in all of us, so valuable for accepting ourselves and others more fully. And a nudge to the darkness of grief, depression, and other mental challenges so prevalent for many, especially this time of year. If you have a story to share, let Michael know.

Our church supports Family Promise by being a host site for families experiencing homelessness. We provide a warm, welcoming space and meals prepared by volunteer church congregants for four weeks throughout the year. When the host week is the week between Christmas and New Year's (one of our weeks this year), families are housed at a local hotel and the host site raises money for families to eat at local restaurants and purchase extra groceries for their hotel rooms.

Proposed Revision to the “Purposes” of the Unitarian Universalist Association

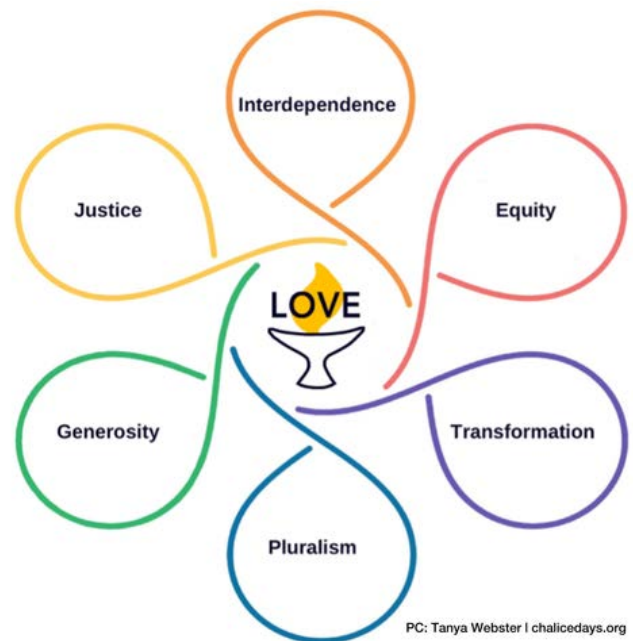
After extensive engagement with UUs across our faith tradition, the Article II Study Commission have completed their Final Proposed Revision to Article II of the UUA Bylaws. This is a big change, replacing the well-known “principles and purposes” section of the bylaws. The “flower” image on this page would become part of Article II.

This process began in 2020, when the Article II Study Commission was charged by the UUA Board to review that section of UUA Bylaws that includes the Principles, Purposes, and Sources. The Commission was to propose revisions that will enable our faith tradition to be a relevant and powerful force for spiritual and moral growth, healing, and justice. The Commission held thousands of conversations with UUs and developed a proposal that went before a vote at the 2023 General Assembly. Delegates voted to move forward with a process to discuss further changes and approved several amendments to the Commission’s proposal. In the months since GA 2023, the Commission has worked to incorporate those amendments into a final document for congregations to review. That document, the Final Proposed Revision to Article II, is now available.

At GA 2024, UUs from across the nation will vote on whether to adopt this revision as the new Article II of the UUA Bylaws.

The UUA invites all UUs to review the Final Proposed Revision to Article II and absorb what it means to you and your congregation or community. Read the Article II Final Proposed Revision at www.uua.org/uuagovernance/committees/article-ii-study-commission/final-proposed-revision-article-ii
