In pastoral care, the focus is on you – your feelings, your questions, your whole you. Pastoral care offers you a confidential space to name and contemplate the challenges in your life. In pastoral care we assume that the answers most helpful to you will likely come from the wisdom already within you. Pastoral care is about **listening**, listening with a caring heart, **suspending judgment** as best as possible, and **being fully present**.

To **receive pastoral care** you can reach out directly to any of our Pastoral Care Associates or you can set up an appointment with our minister, Rev. Michael Leuchtenberger by email, text, cell phone, or by stopping by his office in person. You can recognize our Pastoral Care Associates by the **green ribbon** they wear attached to their name tags.

12/1/2024 “Repair is Possible” Donna Moore

12/8/2024 “Showing Up” Rev. Michael Leuchtenberger

Rabbi Sharon Brous, in her book “The Amen Effect,” makes the simple yet compelling case for our need to “show up for the celebration, and to show up for the funeral. And to err on the side of presence.” Grieving alone is no better than celebrating alone. There is power and necessity in showing up when life adds another entry on the “Good News Wall” and when we are walking through the “Valley of the Shadow of Death.” Neither should happen in isolation. Both need the community to be present.

12/15/2024 “Being Present to Difference” Rev. Michael Leuchtenberger

As Unitarian Universalists we readily proclaim our commitment to valuing diversity, to accepting people with varied beliefs and backgrounds. We see ourselves as welcoming people from a broad range of life experiences and as affirming diverse expressions of lifestyles. Yet many of us struggle right now to be present to difference, to respect difference, and engage difference when our values are not aligned and our moral foundations have different priorities. How do we build bridges? When do we build bridges? For bridges need building - to help create a world that can feel inclusive to the diversity that is real and all around us. Being present to difference might require meeting people where they are - even when that is uncomfortable.

Sunday Morning Kids' Connections

Our Sunday morning children's programs continue to evolve as we learn what our families need and what our staff and volunteers have to offer. Our age groupings are chosen for appropriate child development, safety, and fun for all. Right now the age groups are 0-4 (Rainbow Room nursery) and 5-13 (Young Explorers.) We hope to divide the older group into two groups as the program grows.

Young Explorers (ages 5 to 13) happens three Sundays per month:

- 1st Sundays | 10 am to 12:45 pm
- 2nd & 3rd Sundays | 10 am to 12:30 pm

Young Explorers begin their morning in the Sanctuary, through a Time for All Ages. Then they will go with our Young Explorer Guides, Sosa Machaba and Dory LeCount, to learn, grow, and play in the Young Explorers program.

On the 4th and 5th Sundays, this age group joins their family in the Sanctuary for worship.

The Rainbow Room nursery is for ages 6 weeks to 4 years old. For the safety of the youngest UUs, we kindly request that the older kids be with the Young Explorers or with their families.

NEW! Octagon Dinners

Are you looking to make connections with more people in our UU church? Do you enjoy having conversations over a shared meal at the home of a friend? Would you like to expand your network of UU friends and acquaintances? Then sign up to join the Octagon Dinners!

Dinners take place three times: January, March, and May. (See dates below.) Names of those who want to attend are chosen randomly to join in a group of eight people for dinner. For the next meal, all names will go back in a hat and are again chosen randomly for the second dinner, etc. The number of “octagons” depends on how many groups of eight people sign up to participate. In this way, you’ll perhaps meet new people at each dinner!

Details:

- Meals are potluck
- Host gets to choose
 - what they will make, and will coordinate with others about contributions
 - the time of the dinner
- Conversation starters will be offered, but the group is free to decide how the conversation goes
- Names go into “hats” and names are drawn until there’s a total of 8 for dinner, including the host(s)
- Dates are January 11, March 8, and May 10. However, once the groups are set up, that group is free to change the date of their dinner.
- Deadlines to sign up are January 2, February 22, and April 22.
- Upon request, the church will try to offer two hours of childcare. Parents/guardians would drop their kids off at the church and then enjoy dinner at the host’s home. Please sign up well ahead of the deadline so we can meet this need.

Covenant Group Open Enrollment January 1 to 19, 2025

Covenant groups are groups of ten to twelve people who meet monthly for a check-in and facilitated discussion of a topic of interest. These groups allow our members and friends to develop deeper relationships with people and to form circles of care for mutual celebration and support in times of struggle. Many of our groups explore the monthly worship theme in their meetings. Participants are encouraged to make this a high-priority commitment of at least one year. Meetings last between 90 minutes and two hours. You may join in person and/or on Zoom.

Why join a Covenant Group?

Regular monthly participation allows members to develop trust, mutual respect, and deep connection while supporting your own spiritual discernment. Each group develops its own covenant, or set of promises, that they make to one another. Many groups designate one person as the regular facilitator and some share that responsibility among their members. Groups are encouraged to work together on at least one service project each year.

Though we are often unaware of it, uncertainty is part of our daily reality. We tend to assume that things will go as we are accustomed. We are likely to get upset or frustrated if things don't go the way we had expected. Then at some turn, life circumstances unfold in such a way in which the experience of uncertainty is brought to the fore of our attention. When we open to the uncertainty of the unknown we may experience fear. It is a natural response. We can practice walking courageously with our fear, not trying to get away from it. We can learn to become intimate with uncertainty, recognizing that in every moment we are moving into the unknown. We may experience more connection to life through this process.

In this daylong retreat, we will take time to explore the practice of walking with our fear and opening to the unknown, together in community. Rae Houseman, meditation teacher, mindfulness mentor, and trauma therapist, will lead us in a day of exploring questions together through lessons and meditations.

CONTEMPLATIVE PRACTICES

Walk the Labyrinth before or after Taizé First Sundays of the Month

Our monthly Taizé-style services are on the first Sunday of every month, October through April. We would love to have you join us online or in-person on **Sunday, December 1st** for an hour of meditative singing, a brief reading, a period of extended silence, and candle lights.

Contemplative music will welcome you in the Sanctuary and online by 6:50 pm and the service will begin at 7 pm. Online you can find the service live streamed at concorduu.org/live.

In addition, all are welcome to the meditative experience of walking the **Labyrinth**. The Labyrinth is set up in Fellowship Hall before or after the Taizé service. The Labyrinth will open at 6pm.

Our Taizé Service strives to be a contemplative and spiritual experience for anyone seeking inner peace and a loving, compassionate heart. As one participant put it: "A time of beauty and peace for body and spirit."

Happiness is A Muscle: Wisdom and Practices from Positive Psychology
