10/5/2025 "From Empathy to Compassion" Rev. Michael Leuchtenberger

Empathy is feeling with someone - absorbing their pain, mirroring their distress. It's powerful and connecting, but it can also be overwhelming and paralyzing. Compassion adds something crucial: it holds awareness of suffering and the desire to alleviate it, but with enough emotional equilibrium to actually be useful. It's empathy plus wisdom and action. How do we move from empathy to compassion? How do we create the space to offer what is helpful, to recognize our limits, and to help others connect to their resilience?

Self-compassion is a challenge for all of us. So many things can get in the way of being our own best friend. Come think about ways to tame the inner critic, change the stories we tell ourselves, and love ourselves into the present moment and connection with others.

How do we build compassionate bridges between people and communities that do not trust, respect, or value each other? So many bridges have been destroyed in recent years. Many continue to be under attack. It may take generations to re-build some of what has been lost. What foundations can we lay today? How can compassion help guide the construction needed toward a less polarized future that embraces disagreements and diversity of values without disdain and disgust?

10/26/2025 "Compassion Fatigue" Rev. Michael Leuchtenberger

When the gap between the suffering we witness and our capacity to respond become overwhelming and unbearable it is time to pause - both as individuals and as a community. Compassion fatigue is a kind of moral injury. It is crucial to name it honestly rather than push through with gritted teeth before unacknowledged fatigue hardens into cynicism or burnout. How do we give ourselves permission to rest when needed? How do we recharge the "batteries" on which our compassion depends for insight and action?

Our theme for October is "Cultivating Compassion."


You Are Invited to Join Us in Exploring the Power of Myth! Series Begins Wed, October 15 | 6:30-8:30pm

Fiscal Year 2024-25 ended with a surplus

Our fiscal year ending July 31, 2025 had a wonderfully successful year in our operating budget. Our operating budget ended the year with an operating surplus of \$2,790. However, we spent \$2,615 on a capital expense (tech deck computer) using operating income, as planned. In essence, we ended the year with a surplus of \$175.

We had budgeted for a shortfall of about \$11,000, which would have been covered by the Operating Reserve Fund (ORF). No withdrawal from the ORF was needed. In addition, we received a windfall of \$17,434 from the George Griffin Trust, which would have made the surplus that much larger. Instead, it was transferred to the Operating Reserve Fund as the congregation voted at the 2025 Annual Meeting. Therefore, the total in the Operating Reserve Fund as of July 31, 2025 has increased to \$48,147.
